10th or the office by Friday, Nov. 15th.

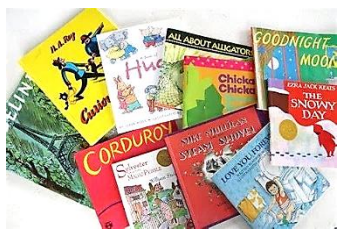
PACKING PARTIES

CURE CORNER



Friends,

It is a long-held tradition that the first Sunday after November 1 is celebrated throughout

the Episcopal Church as All Saints Sunday. This feast of the church dates back to the earliest celebrations of those virtuous and godly martyrs that suffered under the widespread persecution of Christians in the third and fourth centuries. In England and the British Isles, this celebration began to be held on November 1 and in the year 865, the pope fixed this date as the official commemoration of all the saints of the Christian calendar. In the calendar of the church year, we are allowed to celebrate the feast on the first Sunday after November 1. As we read the necrology (list of the dead) during the Prayers of the People at both churches this Sunday, Eric will "toll" a gong as each name is read, a sound reminiscent of the tolling of a church bell.

We celebrate more than just the saints in heaven, however. We celebrate the life and labors of all Christians, past and present, and we especially seek to encourage the saints among us, really all of us, to continue in the work God has given us to do: loving our neighbors as ourselves (as we would wish to be loved) and loving God from whom all blessings indeed flow.

The blessings we are given by God include not only our lives and the lives of those we

love, they also include opportunities to help those among us who need support in bad times, hard times, and in-between times. Here on the Eastern Shore, the communities of faith up and down Highway 13 valiantly do what they can to help the unhoused and hungry. Hungars Cure Parish is a vital part of this work through ongoing volunteer work with Dos Santos, Northampton Social Ministries, and through emergency assistance by means of the Rector's Discretionary Fund.

The loose plate offering on All Saints Sunday (as it is on almost all first Sundays throughout the year) will be given to the Rector's Discretionary Fund, a fund gathered and disbursed to help those in immediate and pressing need in and around our communities here on the Shore. Consider adding even a little more shine to those halos I have seen hovering over heads by making a donation of any size to this fund, either anonymously through loose change and bills, or by check made payable to your parish with Discretionary Fund on the memo line. In just the seven weeks that I have been your Rector, there have been numerous requests for emergency aid and while we have been able to provide assistance to almost every one who has asked, our funds are getting low as winter looms near.

Who are the saints of God? Consider verse three of Hymn 293 in *The Hymnal 1982*: "They lived [the saints of God] not only in ages past, there are hundreds of thousands still, the world is bright with the joyous saints who love to do Jesus' will. You can

meet them in school, or in lanes, or at sea, in church, or in trains, or in shops, or at tea, for the saints of God are just folk like me, and I mean to be one too."
