**Operation Christmas Child** 



This picture shows preparations for the packing party. On Sunday November 7 at Hungars and Christ Church we had packing parties for Operation Christmas Child shoeboxes. The supplies were partially purchased with a \$500 grant from Thrivent Insurance Company. Many parishioners also purchased supplies and others paid for shipping costs. Several people filled boxes

on their own. On Monday, November 15th 147 boxes were delivered to the collection area to be joined with boxes all over the Shore, and then the nation.

The boxes will ultimately be presented to children all over the world, most of whom have never had a gift before. Included in their boxes will be a pamphlet explaining the Gospel in their own language. They will also have an opportunity to take a course in Christianity in a local setting. Not only is this a ministry of love to children it helps share the Gospel to their families and communities.

## **Hungars Thrift Shop**

For nearly 2 years, the Parish Thrift Shop has been shuttered by the pandemic. During this sleepy time many of the volunteers have moved away or "moved on". The building that we have been using rent-free for several years was put up for sale even as demolition and renovation work begun above and around our little shop. It has been hard to envision resuming business as usual.



Dos Santos food distribution takes place at Christ Church every third Sunday where migrant workers are invited to come to the Thrift Shop to take what they can use. We have been delighted to see so many happy customers come and go, carrying away the clothing and household items that will make life easier for them. We have also twice opened specifically for new teachers and other staff in Northampton County schools. We charged \$3.00 for each bag taken and meeting the young teachers and chatting with them was a joy; so many had just arrived on the shore and were eager to meet friendly non-school people and learn more about the shore.

On November 13<sup>th</sup> we were open to the general public for 2 hours. The shop filled with new friends and old ones who let us know how much they have missed us.

Shoppers were invited to fill a bag for \$5.00, and raised about \$120.00.

Some of the new teachers returned; one said that her Thrift Shop purchases had been her favorite things to wear at school.

The Thrift Shop remains one of Hungars' viable and useful ministries, and it will be exciting to see how the shop evolves in the future.

Sadly, we will be saying goodbye to our wonderful chairman, Marion Roe who will be moving in December. For many years Marion has been managing the shop single-handedly seeing the store through many interesting times (remember the summer that fleas shut us down?) and a change in location. Through various climate challenges, and in tough negotiations, she's been supremely competent, gracious, and well-loved, and will surely be missed. God bless you, Marion!

## **OUTREACH COMMITTEE**

As the year winds down, we look back on some of the ways Hungars Cure Parish has shared its abundance with our neighbors:

- 147 boxes were filled for Operation Christmas Child.
- Monthly baskets of snacks are delivered to Kiptopeke Elementary as a morale booster for staff.
- We've supplied teams who prepare one meal each month at the Exmore Soup Kitchen.
- We've planned monthly collections of items that have benefited the SPCA and the nutritional programs of the ESAAA.
- Significant contributions have been made to support the work of Dos Santos, Habitat for Humanity, ESCC (Crandall Scholarship), Camp Chanco, Camp Silver Beach, and Occohannock-on-the-Bay.

When the Outreach Committee was formed several years ago, we hoped to increase opportunities for meaningful, thoughtful giving in many different ways. We research, assess, the needs of which we become aware, and we actively seek the involvement and input of the congregation.

## **COVID PROTOCOLS UPDATE**

Hungars Church Vestry met and determined to continue the mild protocols in respect of COVID to be appropriate. For the time being: Altar Party (priest, lay readers, ushers) will wear masks, a slightly shorter service, and weather permitting - the windows will be opened. The ropes will remain on the pews for social distancing and masks are available for all entering if they choose. Communion in one kind (bread only).

<u>Christ Church Vestry</u> did not discuss the protocols at their meeting. We will continue with the priest and altar party wearing masks and social distancing is to be observed where possible. Communion in bread only.

Thank you for respecting our public health concerns and pray our period of lowered rates of COVID here on the Shore remain so. We monitor them and will change our protocols if infection rates rise above 8.5 %.

## A NOTE FROM PRES TROWER

As we near the end of the year, it is time to reflect on what we have accomplished. So much has transpired in the past year. We have managed to reopen church thus far safely and with much hopefulness on the upcoming year. We have new kneelers in place and they are a delight to use, especially for us that don't have the best knees in the world. Lots of work has taken place on the rectory, including: lock repair to all doors, window repair, removing vines taking over the carriage house and its ceiling removal to prevent and stop mold. We installed a water filter in the rectory and a new more efficient water heater. In the parish hall angels completed a new office space for Reverend Janet, Junior Warden Dixon, made new traffic stanchions for the parish, painted the benches, and a new space for the upcoming library.

One of our greatest achievements is calling Reverend Janet to be our Rector. The Letter of Agreement is completed, and the Celebration of New Ministry will be Tuesday, January 11<sup>th</sup>, 4:00 p.m. at Hungars, with Bishop Susan Haynes presiding. With Reverend Janet at the helm, we can look forward to even more vitality and strength in both our churches.

As we look forward to even greater ways to serve the Lord and glorify His name, we must with glad hearts do all we can to accomplish what is possible. In this we should reach down in our hearts, minds and souls to furnish the tools necessary to expand God's Kingdom.





Pianist Lee Jordan-Anders is Professor of Music and Artist-in-Residence Emerita at Virginia Wesleyan College in Norfolk, Virginia, where she served on the faculty for twenty-nine years. She was the Music Director and Conductor of the Orchestra of the Eastern Shore from 2009 to 2014. She received Bachelor and Master of Music degrees in Piano Performance from Northwestern University's School of Music where she studied piano with Pauline Lindsey. She continues to be an active performer and scholar, giving concerts and lectures throughout the United States. During the fall of 2005 she was in residence at the Cité Internationale des Arts in Paris . She has worked extensively with the Chrysler Museum of Art in Norfolk, and recently released her fifth CD recording, Images: Works for Solo Piano by Claude Debussy.
